O Heavenly King, Comforter, and Spirit of Truth, come and abide in the hearts of those who make decisions in this world. Enlighten their understanding to perceive Your holy will and lead them into the ways of the Gospel of Peace. Soften the hearts of the powerful, protect the oppressed in the Middle East, and comfort those who mourn, so that all humanity may dwell in tranquillity, glorifying Your all-holy Name: of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Prayer

O Almighty God and Heavenly Father, who rules over all nations and governs the hearts of rulers, we come before You in humility and repentance, confessing that we have not lived as Your people ought, and that the sins of the world bear bitter fruit in violence and war. Break the bow, shatter the spear, and silence the weapons that bring death to the innocent. We lift before You all who suffer in this present conflict, in lands torn by violence across the Middle East: families displaced, homes destroyed, the wounded, the grieving, and the fearful.

Govern, we ask You, the hearts of kings, leaders, and commanders, for their authority is from You alone. Turn them from pride, vengeance, and reckless ambition, and grant them wisdom, restraint, and a true desire for peace. Teach them that they are but Your servants, accountable to Your न्याय (justice), and called to preserve life, not destroy it.

Set limits to destruction, and in Your appointed time, grant a just and lasting peace among nations. For we know, O God, that all kingdoms of this world are passing, but Your kingdom alone endures forever, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is our peace. Amen.

For this we humbly pray to You, O Christ our God, for peace among humans in every country, for peace among peoples, and for the welfare of the whole world, that we may live in harmony and may work without hindrance deeds pleasing to You.

For You are our peace, and to You we send up glory, together with Your Father Who is without beginning, and Your Most-holy, Good and Lifegiving Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.
